# Tribute to Anthony Lunch, who helped plant the seed of hope in Education for children across Helambu!

First of all, on behalf of HELP and the entire community associated with HELP and the people of Helambu in Nepal, we would like to express our tributes to our most valuable supporter, the founder of MondoFoundation and a great human being who sadly passed away in October of 2022. We also express our condolences to Martine, Nick, Cecilia, Chris, Jenny, and the Lunch family.

We vividly remember Anthony Lunch and his wife Martine visiting Nepal for the first time in early 1990. They had travelled to Nepal to visit their son Nick, who was volunteering at Yangrima Boarding School. Little did we know then that he would go on to support the village through the thick and thin of our times. We saw a brand new school building being constructed at Yangrima, and Anthony was a pivotal partner. Anthony knew that his vision had the potential to connect and support many other communities around the world and didn't stop at one school. Upon this foundation, MondoChallenge set up a charitable arm in 2004. Galvanized in his belief that lasting change best takes place when people come together, hundreds have gone on to volunteer worldwide. Scores of supporters have raised millions of pounds to cater for the immediate needs of communities, educating children, lifting people out of economic difficulty and providing relief during times of emergency.

Anthony never waited for the big charities and organisations to act but often became a superjet force and acted quickly. He inspired everyone connected to Mondo to believe in "self-reliance" whilst doing charitable work. In 2009, Anthony helped us to set up HELP – Helambu Education and Livelihood Partnership (HELP)- now Mondo's key partner in Nepal where we started from a modest £25,000 grant that has gone on to support hundreds of schools across Nepal. He remained a loyal and steadfast supporter, from putting the foundation of the first school in Helambu since developing a partnership at HELP to all the 15 schools we reconstructed after the catastrophic earthquake of 2015. He last visited Nepal in 2017 to observe the schools damaged by the quake and returned with greater urge to help us finish the humongous task of school reconstruction we had undertaken. Without him, not only would we not have accomplished it, but many hundreds of children would not have received safe and proper classrooms in which they are studying now, be in the remote villages of Tartong, Birkharka, Gunsa, Bhotenamlang etc.

Our initial programmes at HELP, which we continue to do, be it organizing scholarships for students, teachers support programmes, volunteering programmes, etc., each had Anthony's contribution. They were much aligned with his vision and earnest dedication to how he believed would make a real difference in people's lives.

In his tribute, we are pleased to share that we will soon launch the "Anthony Lunch Scholarship Fund." In the least way, we will wish to remember him and his work for a very long period of time. 

At the heart of HELP's mission is a participatory and holistic "bottom-up" approach that seeks to bring about meaningful improvements in education.

In addition to its core focus on education and livelihood enhancement, HELP has proven to be a responsive and reliable partner in times of crisis. During significant challenges like the Nepal earthquake in 2015, the COVID-19 pandemic, and the aftermath of floods in Sindhupalchok, HELP has stepped up to provide humanitarian aid and life-saving interventions to affected communities.

Now, let's delve into the highlights of the diverse activities carried out by HELP during the year 2022-2023, all of which are grouped under the following programmes:






# SAATHI TEACHERS PROGRAMME

The Saathi Programme is designed to reduce educational inequality and build strong foundations for primary-level students whose learning is being neglected due to societal attitudes towards the importance of primary school education. We recruit and train passionate candidates to teach in high-need schools for a two-year placement, providing good quality education to children at the primary level (Grades 1-5).



## Saathi Progress 2022-2023

### 1. Tripurasundari RM Baseline Survey

The survey results show a dismal learning level of students in Tripurasundari RM. Even when grade 1-8 students were tested on basic literacy and numeracy questions of grade 3 levels, only 2.93% could respond to division questions; in Math and English, a mere 3.97% of students could solve the comprehension problems, the highest level of questions asked.



### 2. Recruitment of 4th Cohort

Recruitment for the Saathi Teachers Programme began on December 15th 2022, and lasted three months. Over 250 individuals applied for the position, but only 50 made it to the final interview. Ultimately, only 12 candidates were selected for the programme.

### 3. Parents Event- Immersion into the ethos of the Saathi Programme

On March 18th, 2023, after selecting candidates, we held an event called "Immersion into the Ethos of Saathi Programme and Parents Events" to orient the guardians of the new cohort.



#### 4. Panchpokhari Sikai Mela

The Saathi Teachers' inaugural exhibition has transformed and is now known as the "Panchpokhari Sikai Mela." This educational event, aimed at primary-level students, was financially supported by Panchpokhari Rural Municipality and received participation from all the schools within the rural area. A total of 30 schools were involved in the event, including five schools where our Saathi Teachers are placed.



#### 5. Teachers Workshop

We held a 2-day workshop for ten teachers from 5 schools in Tripurasundari RM. The training covered Classroom Management, Teaching Material Preparation, Digital Literacy, Child Psychology, and Parent Management.

#### 6. Expansion of the Programme

Following the Saathi Info session with various local governments, two local governments applied for the Saathi Teachers Programme. Eventually, Abukhaireni RM in Tanahu District was chosen based on working feasibility and criteria set by HELP. On April 7th, the CEO of HELP and the Chief of Abukhaireni RM held a final discussion and signed an MoU for a two-year Saathi Teachers Programme involving 10 Saathis across the five selected schools.



#### 7. Saathi Placement

After completing Saathi School, on April 21st, 12 graduates were placed at nine schools across Panchpokhari RM, Tripurasundari RM in Sindhupalchowk, and Abukhaireni RM in Tanahu District.

#### 8. Saathi Strategic meeting

The entire HELP staff, including the chairperson, came together for the annual strategic meeting. In this gathering, we discuss the exciting prospects for the upcoming year while reflecting on the events and achievements of 2022. We had the wonderful opportunity to visit Yangrima Academy and the Just Nepal Foundation. Their insights into the "Total School Approach" implemented in various schools within Helambu RM were enlightening.

# SCHOLARSHIP AND LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

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In 2010, the HELP Scholarship programme was established with a noble objective: to support bright and financially disadvantaged SEE graduates from the Sindhupalchowk region pursuing higher education (10+2 or equivalent). This program extends its support to an average of 40 students each year, and through this consistent aid, it has successfully empowered a total of 555 students to date. These students have been able to pursue higher education, enabling them to fulfil their educational aspirations.

## Scholarship Progress 2022-2023

### 1. Scholarship Distribution Ceremony

This year, HELP, in collaboration with the Mondo Foundation, awarded scholarships to 45 students from rural public schools. These recipients were meticulously selected through a highly competitive process by a dedicated selection committee. The scholarship awards were based on a comprehensive evaluation, considering the student's academic excellence, financial need, clarity of their ambitions, commitment to community service, and leadership potential.

To ensure fairness, a special committee was formed to thoroughly review each application, carefully reading their essays and conducting one-on-one online interviews. This achievement reflects our commitment to nurturing deserving talents and empowering them to achieve their educational dreams.

During the scholarship distribution ceremony, alumna Srijana Waiba and Bishnu Mijar shared their inspiring journeys, reflecting on their experiences from being scholarship recipients to where they are today. Srijana, who is currently pursuing her Bachelor's degree in New Zealand, offered her heartfelt advice and well-wishes to the current scholarship recipients. She expressed her gratitude to HELP for her remarkable journey, which began as a recipient of School In a Bag and continued through her scholarship years, ultimately leading to her graduation.

# SCHOLARSHIP AND LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

## Bharosa Scholarship

Bharosa is a programme aimed at providing assistance to students who have been left without their primary educational support due to the unfortunate demise of a family member due to COVID-19. Covering all provinces of Nepal, Bharosa places particular emphasis on districts with lower scores on the human development index.

The outreach for scholarship applications was conducted in partnership with the Dish Home service provider and through the Bharosa website. Applications for scholarships were received based on recommendations. In its inaugural year, Bharosa has extended support to 35 students from various corners of the nation, individuals who have lost their educational pillars and are facing challenges in continuing their studies.

Bharosa Scholarship is governed by a team from different walks of life, including Hon. Gagan Thapa, Sudeep Acharya (Dish Home), Manish Jha (Facts Nepal), Ms Charu Chadda (Business 360) and Jimmy Lama (HELP). The scholarship is awarded on an absolute need basis with a monthly financial grant of Rs. 5000 per month per child. Helambu Education and Livelihood Partnership (HELP), with a decade of managing a similar scholarship programme, is hosting the programme for operation. Facts Nepal provides the technical support and data analysis required to drive this programme.

### Bharosa this year:

1. *Scholarship Distribution:* We're aiding 35 students, and payments are made via bank transfers after ensuring each recipient has a bank account. The scholarships are given in four instalments each of Np.15,000.
2. *Board Meeting:* On February 5th, the 6th Bharosa Board meeting occurred at Alice restaurant with all the board members.
3. *Ongoing Oversight:* Rigorous monitoring and evaluation ensure effective scholarship utilisation and impact. Regular calls to recipients and parents ensure follow-up, maintaining program effectiveness.

# SCHOOL IN A BAG

School in a Bag, a UK charity, sends educational resources in bags to marginalised students facing war, famine, natural disasters, and poverty worldwide. Each bag is filled with stationery and tools to support learning and self-expression. HELP has been working with School in a Bag since 2012 and has distributed over 21,000 bags by the end of 2022.

By distributing school bags filled with supplies, the initiative improved access to education, encouraged attendance, and empowered the students for overall development.

The red Schoolbag is a joy of inspiration to most of the students who got the bags. This bag contains necessary items such as:

- Four copies
- Sketch-book
- Pencils, Crayons, Pens and Scale
- Geometry Box
- Water Bottel
- Hygiene Kit

**The hygiene kit was introduced in September 2018 and includes:**

- a handkerchief
- toothbrush
- toothpaste
- comb
- nail-clippers
- soap

**School in a Bag 2022/2023**

We have successfully distributed 1768 bags across 14 schools spanning four districts in the current year.

## **Taplejung**

- Shree Pathivara Basic School-Phungling Municipality-09, Hangdewa. The event involved the distribution of 31 school bags.
- Shree Durga Basic School-Phungling Municipality-09. The distribution event aimed to support 20 students from the Limdu community, whose economic conditions were very poor due to residing in a rural area facing geographical vulnerability.
- Shree Tamor Nadi Basic School-Phungling Municipality-09, Taplejung. During this event, we distributed 69 school bags, to those who were facing challenges accessing educational materials for the entire academic year.

## **Sarlahi**

- Shree Janata Secondary School-Kaduna Rural Municipality-02, Phoolparashi. HELP distributed 115 school bags, along with educational resources and hygiene kits, to the students.

# VOLUNTEERING

We were thrilled to welcome back volunteers from Cambridge University as they dedicated four weeks to contributing across five of our partner schools, collaborating closely with our Saathi teachers. This volunteering initiative operates in tandem with the Saathi teachers' program, which provides comprehensive support to educators and students to enhance their exposure.

During September, ten Cambridge University (CU) volunteers actively engaged with three schools in Tripurasundari Rural Municipality and two schools in Panchpokhari Thangpal Rural Municipality. Their collaboration extended to the schools, local communities, and our Saathi teachers. Each of the five schools where our Saathi teachers were placed had the privilege of hosting two CU volunteers. In their free time following school hours, students focused on enhancing their communication skills, which are pivotal for improved reading, writing, and pronunciation.

The enthusiasm and dedication demonstrated by CU volunteers in striving for transformative educational change have consistently been a source of inspiration. Collaborating with individuals deeply passionate about education enhancement is always a remarkable experience.



# LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMME AND CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMME

## Green-house polytunnel programme

With support from Project Solutions, we have planned to support 15 families affected by COVID-19 by providing them with a greenhouse building and equipment. This is to strengthen the livelihood aspect of our programmes, where we aim to support families in poor economic status to help them grow food throughout the year. This year, we have begun the support in Melamchi Municipality-6 and Chautara Municipality-7 and will continue next year to complete it.



## Construction Programme

At the special request of Paanchpokhari Rural Municipality, we will be supporting the reconstruction of two classrooms at Shree Langarche Secondary School, Laangarche and also equip the school with other educational facilities such as the setting up of early childhood classrooms, library books and science equipment. This is one of the schools in the municipality that did not receive enough attention from the government and other agencies after the earthquake that destroyed the entirety of its physical structures. We have signed an MoU and placed a plan to start the work soon after the monsoon.

Further, we are also pleased to share that we have completed the construction of the Parangtol community building, where we equipped the school with more furniture.



# OTHERS SUPPORT

## Medical emergencies and donations

As always, in addition to our core programmes this year, we, too, have provided some emergency medical support based on needs and requests. Also, we have made one-off grants for the programmes that are deemed meritorious to support that fall within the scope of our partnership. For example, we donated Rs. 100,000 towards the treatment of a cancer patient who is a student of a school we have supported for a very long period of time in the village of Gufa. Similarly, we have also supported the installation of a drinking water supply for a school in Budanilkanta, run under the trust model by the local community.

Similarly, we have arranged to provide tracksuits for over 400 students at Shree Ichowk Secondary School in Helambu in the winter of 2022.



## Evaluation by Social Welfare Council.

Two separate teams were formed by the Social Welfare Council to evaluate the projects HELP has developed and implemented over the last 5 years. The team visited Sindhupalchowk and Rasuwa to assess the wide range of our programmes from school reconstruction, community building, Saathi teachers Programme, Scholarship Programme, School in a Bag support and Greenhouse support etc. The team held a close interaction with most of the key stakeholders from our partner schools, students, local government officials and our staff members. It culminated in a report presentation at the office of the Social Welfare Council.



ITA vision is to bring together educators to better ensure consistency and excellence throughout the educational landscape.



# Budget and Finance

## Summary: HELP Income and Expenditure Summary 2022/2023


HELP's key funder remains Mondo Foundation in the UK through whom several grants have been secured this year towards Saathi Teachers Programme, Scholarship, GreenHouse and School reconstruction programme. Some of the notable supporters behind Mondo Foundation this year were Boltini, Guernsey, BFSS, Waterloo Foundation, ST. James, The Project Solution and several individuals. Our past volunteers also make a huge contribution and this year volunteers raised well over £4000. Another major supporter is School in a Bag who fund all of the SchoolinaBag Programme we do in Nepal. We have also been continuing the provident fund set up in memory of Robin Needham and that continues to support several students. Some of other funders are Interhands supporting our Scholarship Programme and GoGlobal Vermont who are working to raise some funding towards Saathi Programme as well a buying a medical equipment for a remote village of Hagam.

Locally, we have a fantastic growing number of partners at the local government level to co-fund our Saathi teachers Programme. Two municipalities now fully cover the monthly stipend of our Saathi Programme and one covers 70% of the cost. Similarly as we host Bharosa Scholarship programme, we are grateful to Dish Home Pvt. Ltd for their support.

Our total income in the fiscal year 2022 was Rs. 28,393,747.18(Rupees Twenty-eight million, three hundred and ninety-three thousand, seven hundred and forty-seven rupees only), and our total expenditure was Rs. 25,824,608.44(Rupees Twenty-five million eight hundred and twenty-four thousand, six hundred and eight only).


About 52% of the total budget was spent on the Saathi Teachers Programme and about 19% on the Scholarship and Leadership Programme. About 12% is spent on School in a bag programme.

We are delighted to report that we have been able to keep our overhead expenditure very low at 6.1% of the total cost.
